



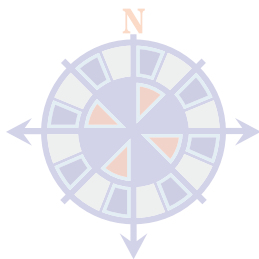
Ship Guide

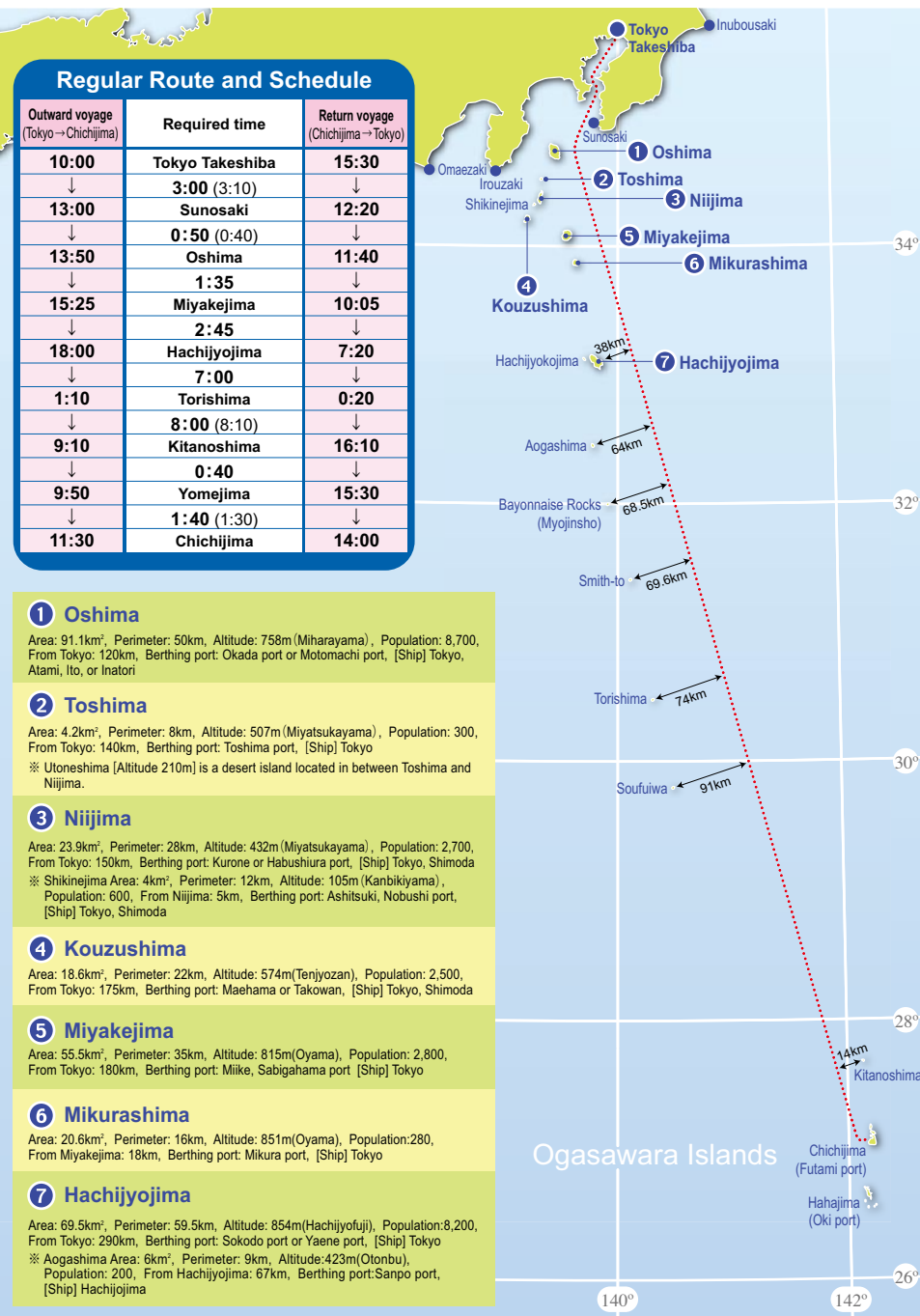

2 Store **C Deck**

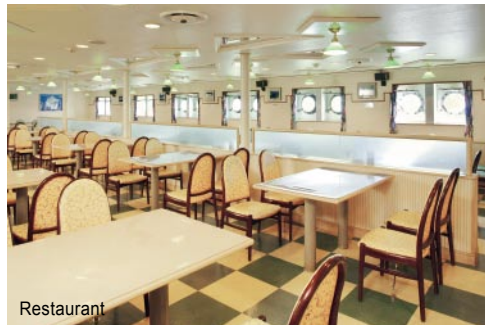

- Please leave your boarding ticket with the Information Desk while watching DVDs.

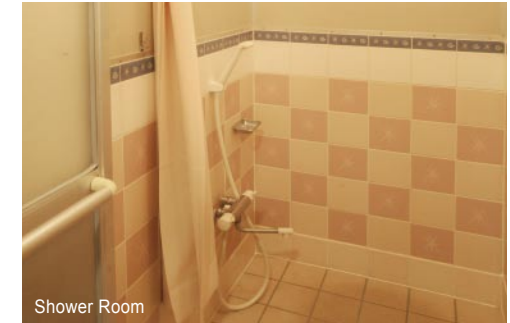

Smoking

Smoking is prohibited in second class and premium second class rooms, and in the restaurant, shower rooms, walkways, entrances, and all other public spaces. Smoking is permitted in the privacy of deluxe and premium first class rooms. Passengers in first class rooms may smoke only if all room occupants agree. Smoking is permitted in the smoking room on A Deck, and outdoors in deck locations where ashtrays are located.

Upgrades

Passengers may upgrade to a higher class of travel any time after boarding, provided that space is available, by paying the difference between the current fare and the fare for the higher class, plus an additional fuel surcharge fee. Payments must be in cash; credit cards are not accepted.

Assembly & Boarding; and More Info about 2nd Class

Assembly

Upright signboards, located either inside the terminal or outside in the plaza area, indicate gathering areas. If traveling in an upper class (Deluxe, Premium First, First, and Premium Second), please gather behind the upper-class signboard. If traveling second class, gather behind the 2nd-class signboard. On busy days there will be more than one second-class signboard set up; gather behind the signboard whose number matches the number written on your ticket.

Boarding

Boarding begins at 9:30 AM on regular days, and at 9:00 AM on busy days. Your passenger list will be collected as you board.

Second-Class Travelers...

Second-class passengers share large carpeted rooms. Each passenger space is supplied with a blanket and pillow. When boarding the ship you will receive a card indicating the number of the space you are to occupy. If you are traveling with others, please be sure to board together. Passenger spaces cannot be reserved; there are no special assignments for "aisle" or "wall" seats. Note that on crowded trips bedding may be spaced closer than shown in the picture.



Women-Only Room

On most days one or more of our second-class rooms are reserved for women only. Accommodation is available on a first-come first-serve basis. If you wish to use this room, please indicate your wish to the attendant as you board. The room is furnished identically to other second-class rooms. Please try to come early; once all spaces have been assigned no further passengers will be accepted. Please note that women-only accommodation may not be available at all on busy days or for other exceptional reasons. If interested, please ask for availability when boarding.

Family Room

On most days one or more of our second-class rooms are reserved for families that include at least one child up to five years of age. Accommodation is available on a first-come first-serve basis. If you wish to use this room, please indicate your wish to the attendant as you board. The room is furnished identically to other second-class rooms. Please try to come early; once all spaces have been assigned no further passengers will be accepted. Please note that family accommodation may not be available at all on busy days or for other exceptional reasons. If interested, please ask for availability when boarding.
