Once upon a time Ogasawara

Ogasawara Kaiun Co., Ltd. was founded in 1969, the year following the return of the Ogasawara Archipelago from the U.S. to Japan. The company started regular cruise service three years later, in 1972. The first ship it sailed, the Tsubaki-maru (1,016 tons), was regularly chartered from its owner, Tokai Kisen Co., Ltd. The Tsubaki-maru cruised from Tokyo to Chichijima in 44 hours. Ogasawara Kaiun purchased the Ukishima-maru from Kansai Kisen in 1973. It renamed the vessel the Chichijima-maru (2,616 tons) and launched a cruise service in the same year. The cruising time from Tokyo to Chichijima was reduced to 38 hours.

The first Ogasawara-maru (3,553 tons), a new ship built exclusively for cruises to the Ogasawara Archipelago, was completed and entered service six years later, in 1979. Equipped with a fin stabilizer (anti-rolling system), the first Ogasawara-maru was an innovative ship capable of cruising from Tokyo to Chichijima in only 28 hours. It remained in service for about 18 years.

The second Ogasawara-maru (6,700 tons) went into service in 1997, further reducing the cruising time from Tokyo to Chichijima to 25 hours and 30 minutes. The vessel plied for 19 years and 3 months, sailing about 1,200 round-trip cruises, or 2,400,000 km in distance (equivalent to 60 voyages around the earth).

The third and newest Ogasawara-maru has now been launched into service. At 11,035 tons, the vessel is 1.6 times heavier than the first Ogasawara-maru, making it Japan's largest regular liner calling upon a remote, isolated island. It can cruise from Tokyo to Chichijima in only 24 hours and accommodates a much larger number of rooms. Compared to the first Tsubaki-maru, the new ship belongs to a totally different age.

Ogasawara Kaiun is committed to providing safe, comfortable cruises to the Ogasawara Archipelago, a registered World Heritage Site, to its guests.

Boarding Procedure

The boarding procedure is completed at check-in counter No. 8 at the Port of Tokyo Takeshiba Ship Terminal.

Check-in time is 9:30-10:40.

*Check-in may start earlier during peak seasons (The year-end and New Year holidays, Golden Week, summer vacation).

Boarding lists are no longer required.

Please notify in advance when a passenger going on board switches from a passenger who registered at the time of the reservation.

Passengers traveling in Economy and Economy berth are notified of their room assignment during boarding procedure. Please arrive at Takeshiba Ship Terminal (Takeshiba Pier) no later than 30 minutes before departure and complete boarding procedure.

● Allowable Carry-on Baggage

Each passenger is permitted to bring two pieces of carry-on baggage for personal travel items. No piece of baggage can exceed 20kg or 200 linear cm (H+W+L).



● Items that cannot be checked as baggage (general cargo)

Items that cannot be checked as baggage: building materials, hazardous materials, electric appliances, motorcycles 126cc or larger, etc. These items must be checked as cargo for a charge. Please bring items that cannot be checked as carry-on baggage and other general cargo items to the

Shibaura Cargo Receiving Office by 12:00 noon the day before the departure date.
*Before boarding the ship, leave your large-size baggage to check.

● General cargo

The baggage charge is 30% higher for items placed in cold storage. Please insure items valued over ¥100,000. (The insurance rate is ¥350 per ¥100,000.)

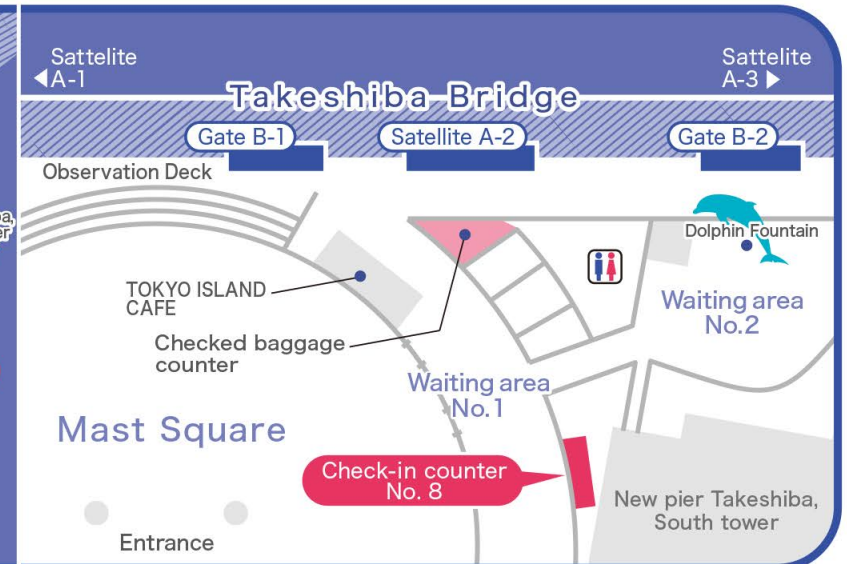
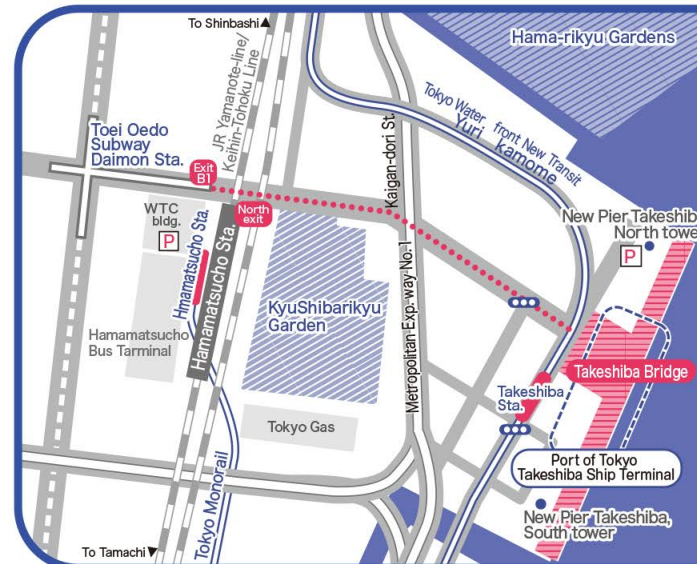

Board the ship. **The QR Code on your boarding pass is scanned at the boarding entrance.**

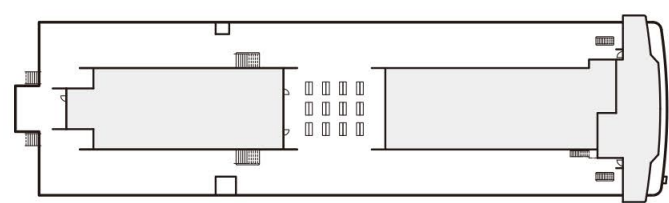
Access Map



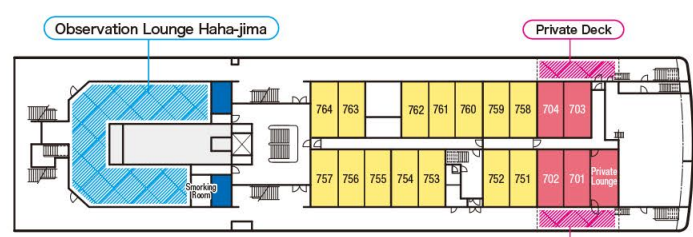
Deck Plan

1 Tokyo International Airport (Haneda Airport)

Located in Ota-ku, Tokyo, Haneda Airport (also called Tokyo International Airport) is the air gateway mainly for domestic flights to Tokyo. A fourth runway was completed in October 2010.

2 Tokyo Bay Aqua-line

Completed in December 1997, this toll bridge-tunnel complex (15.1 km long) links the city of Kawasaki (in Kanagawa Prefecture) with the city of Kisarazu (in Chiba Prefecture). The complex is divided into two sections: a 9.6km tunnel on the Kanagawa side and a 4.4km bridge on the Chiba side.

3 First and Second Coastal Batteries

To protect against foreign invaders, three offshore coastal forts were built during the Meiji period between the present day cities of Futtsu (in Chiba Prefecture) and Yokosuka (in Kanagawa Prefecture). A lighthouse of Japan Coast Guard is established now.

4 Izu Oshima

Izu Oshima is the largest of the Izu Islands and the island closest to Tokyo, situated about 120km (75 miles) to the south of downtown Tokyo. Many tourists visit throughout the year including the trekking of Mt. Mihara which is famous as Gojinka (deified volcano), Mt. Mihara Hot Spring (Miharayama Onsen), and the famous Camellia Festival held from January to March.

5 Miyakejima

Miyakejima is located about 185km (115miles) south of Tokyo. Mt. Oyama, the active volcano at the center of the island, last erupted in 2000, forcing all inhabitants to evacuate. The inhabitants finally began to return and rebuild the island in February 2005. Tourists visit the island to enjoy activities such as fishing and birds watching. To the south is Mikurashima, a smaller island shaped like an inverted bowl.

6 Hachijojima

Located about 290km (180 miles) from Tokyo, Hachijojima takes the form of a gourd with two prominent mountains, Mt. Hachijofuji to the north and the 700 meter (2,297 ft) Mt. Mihara to the south. Thousands of tourists visit the island's many hot springs throughout the year. The Ogasawara-maru calls at Hachijojima each June, linking the island with Chichijima.

7 Mukojima (Bridgegroom Island)

Mukojima, the northernmost island of the Ogasawara Archipelago, is situated about 930km (578 miles) from Tokyo. Though uninhabited at present, the island was home to stock farmers before World War II. A plan for migrating albatross to the island has been promoted since 2006. Nakodo-jima (Matchmaker Island) and Yomejima (Bride Island) are two other prominent Mukojima Islands.



Q&A : about Ogasawara-maru

Q. Can we see whales or dolphins from the ship?

A. Whales and dolphins appear on rare occasions on a voyage, but we cannot make any promises. These creatures are wild and cannot be second-guessed. Bottlenose dolphins and spinner dolphins can be seen almost throughout the year in the waters around Chichijima and Hahajima.

Since the whale watching by boat is popular in the island, how about participating in a tour by all means?

Q. Can I use my credit cards?

Credit cards are not available in a ship.

A. Please be sure to bring enough cash (Japanese YEN) because credit cards are not accepted in the island either.

Q. How is the weather in the area? What type of clothing should I bring?

A. The inside of the ship may be significantly cooled or heated by air conditioning. Passengers are therefore advised to carry clothes to keep warm or cool.

For your reference, the chart below shows the peak temperatures and precipitation levels on Chichijima month by month.

Q. How long does it take to get off the ship?

A. It depends on the number of passengers. It may take about 30 minutes from arrival at port.

Q. Are the showers provided with shampoo, etc.?

A. Shampoo, conditioner, and body soap are prepared. The types, however, are standard. If you prefer types that better suit your skin, we recommend that you use them.

Q. Can I use my cell phone and Wi-Fi during my trip?

A. Cell phone service is available on the ship, in Tokyo Bay, and around Chichijima, but not in other areas.

No Wi-Fi is available anywhere.

Q. Does the ship roll during the trip?

A. The ship pitches and rolls. The fin stabilizer (anti-rolling system) limits these movements, but they may be significant in rougher seas. Please be careful when walking around the ship.

● Chichijima

Village Bus

You can get around Chichijima by village bus. There are two routes: one that circles the main area, and another that run to Kominato Beach on the south of the island.
